Keep professional boundaries

You can keep professional boundaries with your support worker when you



- only do things that are in your service agreement
- talk to each other about problems in a way that
 - is easy to understand
 - shows respect



- tell visitors they can **not** ask your support worker to do things.



Think about ways you can agree to make sure you and your support worker have a safe work relationship.

For example, how will you let each other know if something is **not** part of your service agreement?

Respect and an inclusive home

You can show respect and have an inclusive home when you



- know that it is OK to say **NO**



- are kind to other people



- give someone the care and support they need



- respect a person's culture and religion.



Think about ways you can agree to make sure people in your home get respect and feel welcome.

For example, there will be **no** violence or **abuse**. Abuse is when one person hurts another person. Abuse can be words or actions.



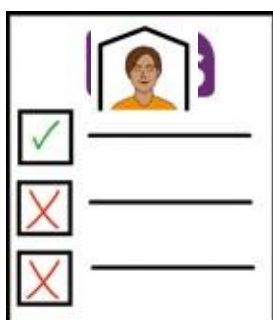
A safe Home



You can make sure your home is a safe place to be when you

- tell someone if you are hurt

and



- make sure there are rules to keep people safe
 - for example, people and things are lifted in a safe way.



Talk about ways you can keep people who work in your home safe.



For example, do **not** leave things on the floor that someone could trip over.
